About Lucy Pittaway

Lucy is an artist living in North Yorkshire. She has won lots of awards for her work and has become famous for her animal art. Her paintings are bright and happy with flowers, trees and animals such as sheep, cows, pigs, and dogs.



The use of colour is important to Lucy. Some of her work contains bright blues, greens, pinks and yellows. Some uses soft pastel shades and some paintings are dark and moody.



How does Lucy draw and paint?

First Lucy draws her ideas in a sketchbook. Then she paints with soft chalk pastel, this is the most widely used form of pastel.



Did you know that when Lucy uses soft chalk pastels, she blends the colour with her fingers, palms and knuckles!

Where does she find ideas?

Lucy loves to make people smile. Her ideas come from the world around her. This could be from her children, animals on the farm where she lives or from her friends and family.

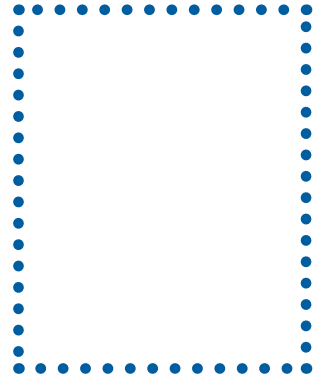

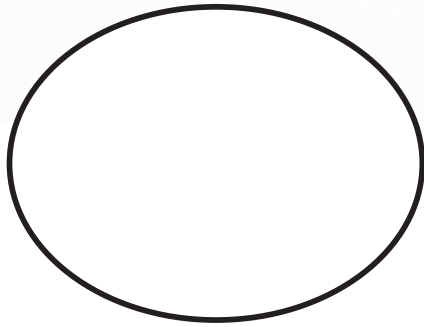

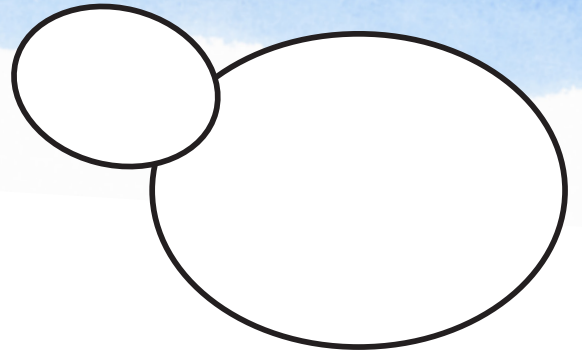


How to draw a simple sheep, similar to Lucy's style, in 6 steps!

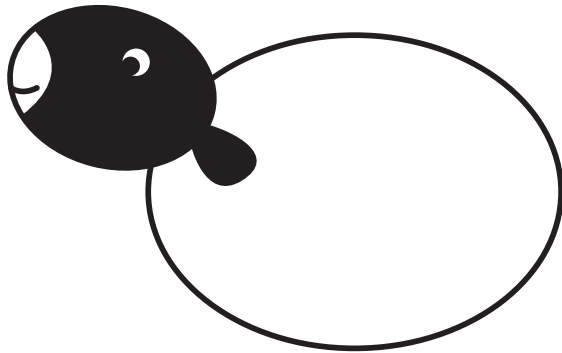

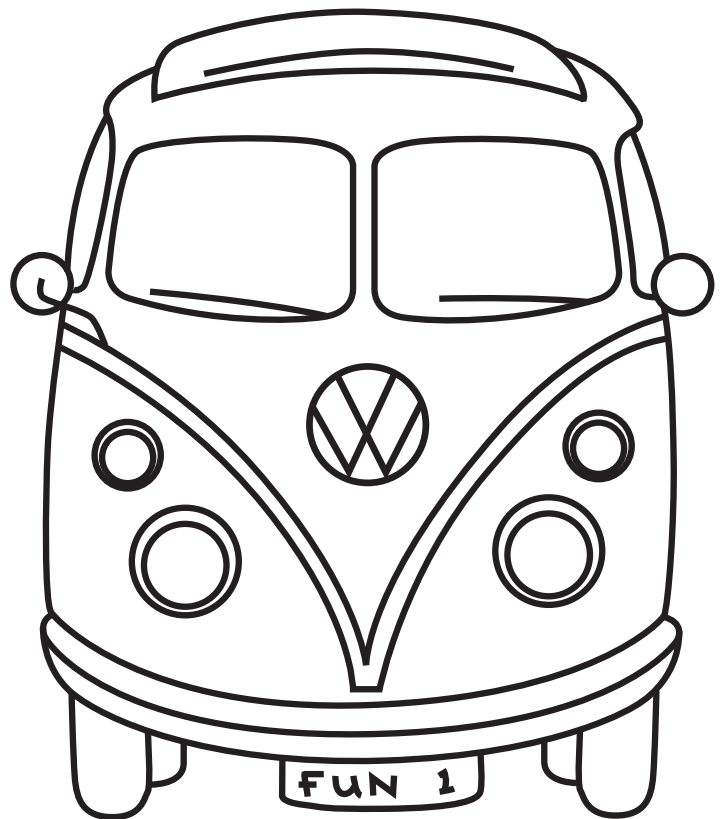

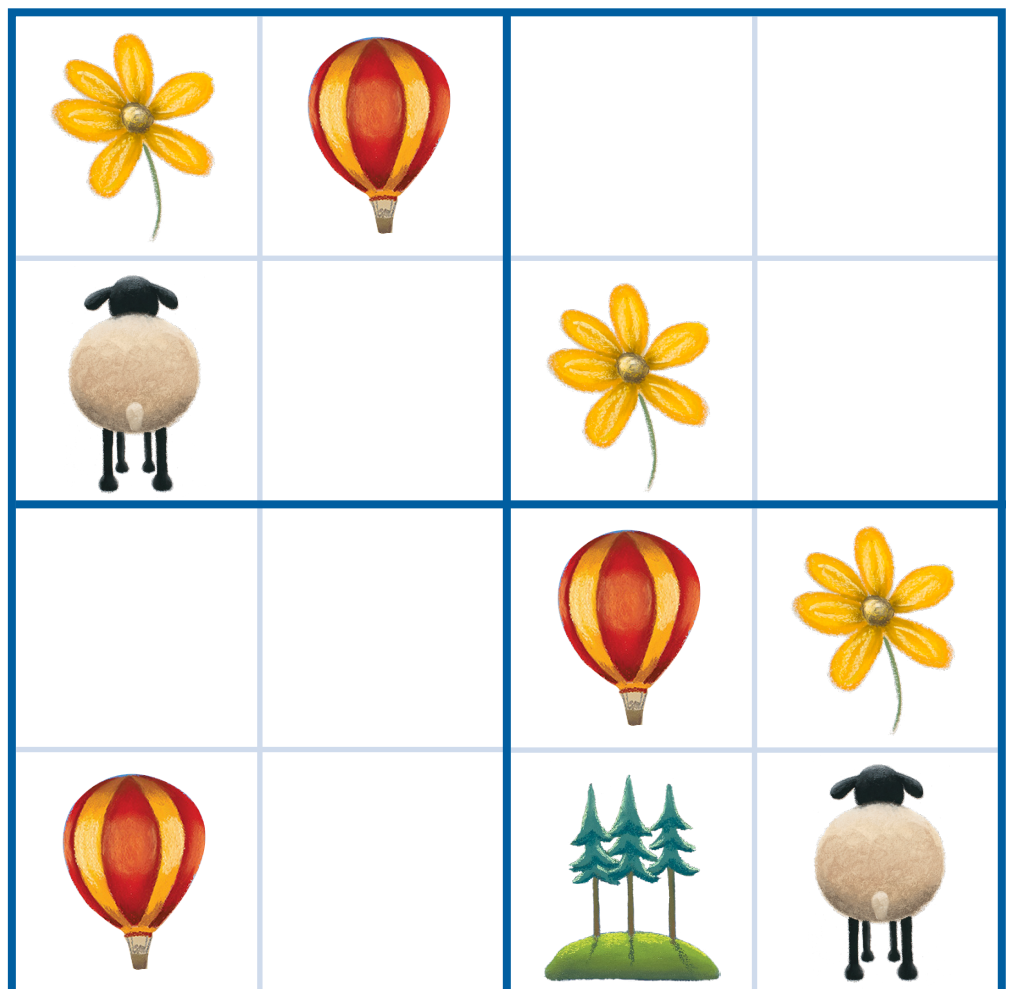
Colouring Fun!
